

XI. Students

A. Enrollment:

1. Attendance. A pupil shall be permitted to begin school if the child shall arrive at the age of five years before midnight, July 31. Gifted children shall follow the County Plan. However, no child shall start school that school year if he is not five years old by December 31.
2. A student in grades 9-12 shall enroll in at least four units each semester in addition to physical education and music. Students participating in the Vocational Center in Jamestown shall have two hours of class work there. No student shall have more than 1 ½ periods of study hall per day.
Students enrolled in Montpelier High School may take a subject by correspondence even if the course is offered in this school; however the student must pay for the course. All correspondence courses must be approved by the administration if the district is to pay for the course.
3. Drop/Add Policy Students will not be allowed to drop or add a class after the first five days of a quarter without permission from the administration. Parents must approve of the schedule change.
4. Tuition. High School and elementary tuition may be charged for all out-of-district students who come from a district where there is no school. The amount charged shall be the difference between the county average and the foundation payment.
5. Student Council. The Montpelier Public School shall provide for a Student Council.
6. Transfer Students. The school administration shall evaluate the credits of students who transfer from another school. A completed constant course shall be given indicated credit. Any student who has been suspended or expelled from another district will not be admitted to enroll in Montpelier District until eligible to re-enroll in his or her former district or until the Board or the Superintendent has reviewed the prior suspension and determined that the suspension was illegal or improperly given.
7. Married or unmarried pupils may attend school providing their conduct and appearance is acceptable. A married or pregnant pupil's participation in extra-curricular activities shall be determined by the superintendent, physician, parent, and school board. Our school shall not discriminate against any student on the basis of pregnancy.
