Materials needed for class:

- Textbook: physical or electronic
- Chromebook or notebook for taking notes and submitting assignments
- Folder for assignments, projects and other information
- Pencils, **no pen allowed on announced paper based assessments**
- Other materials may be requested for specific assignments or projects (colored pencils, scissors, glue, etc.)
- Planners are strongly recommended - physical or electronic

Classroom Expectations:

- Follow School Rules be they written or oral
- Be prepared
 - Have assignments done on time (start of class unless noted)
- Do your best and do your own work
 - Assignments should be completed in a neat & presentable manner
- Treat everyone and their property with respect
- Pay Attention
 - Follow directions written and oral
- When there is a substitute or student teacher his/her directions are to be followed unless violate school policy

Grading:

Grades are based on total points for each assignment. Seventh grade through Ninth grade have their final grade based on total points earned for each grading period. Tenth grade through Twelfth grade have their final grade based on points by category (assignments, tests, projects, etc.). The grade scale set by the school is:

The lowest A is 90%
The lowest B is 80%
The lowest C is 70%
The lowest D is 60%

Work is due at the start of the next class day unless otherwise stated. Any work not completed when due is considered late and will be docked 10% for each day it is late. After one week the the assignment will be graded at teacher's discretion (best possible grade of 50%).
